

Following the 4 th Call for AHA Reference Sites 2022, a total of 65 regions have been awarded "Reference Site" status.

These AHA Reference Site regions have demonstrated the existence of comprehensive strategies to advance health & Care innovation and to understand and address a life-course approach to active and healthy ageing. They successfully bring together a coalition of stakeholders based on a "Quadruple Helix" model that includes representatives from government, health and care providers, policy makers, academia, researcher institutions, industry, civil society, and patients at a regional and local level. These collaborations have facilitated and driven structural change far beyond the scope any one particular organisation could achieve on its own, helping to create an environment for other regions across Europe to learn, transfer and adapt knowledge and good practices to local realities, with regional and social and economic development as the long-term objective thereby creating opportunities to support economic development.

The AHA Reference Site status has been granted to those regions who have shown excellence in the development, adoption and scaling up of innovative practices to address a life-course approach to active and healthy ageing. Their work aligns with the strategic priorities at European, national and regional levels.

For the first time, 2 Phases to the application were introduced which provided regions with the opportunity to demonstrate evidence against the 6 criteria to becoming an AHA Reference Site, as well as undertaking a maturity self-assessment using a tailored version of the SCIROCCO Toolkit designed for AHA Reference Sites. The results from the Maturity Self-Assessment will provide Reference Sites with opportunities for mentoring and coaching each other so that individually they can continue to mature and develop to address the life-course approach to active and healthy ageing within their region; and collectively they can ensure a sustainable system of Reference Sites for the future.
